- III. Agenda Items
 - A. Safety Discussion
 - 1. 2035 is the deadline to implement a variety of safety measures, per House Bill 84
 - 2. The fence around the school was assessed by Travis and further evaluation is needed for the gates in the open areas and pylons around the front
 - 3. Changes in the fencing would change the safe walking routes
 - a) It is possible to have the gates to the school yard lock during school hours only, to be determined how to enforce that option
 - 4. Funding is still needed for major upgrades
 - 5. Travis defined the difference between “target hardening” to protect the students when sheltering in place from an external threat and wellness programs aimed to deescalate upset students. Protecting Windows from outside problems

 - a) Fence by 2032
 - b) “Guardian” in the works
 - (1) West and South Jordan police do a lot for schools
- B. Land Trust Plan Review
 - 1. Monitoring Quarterly Goals and Progress monitoring
 - 2. Brooke Anderson (district data specialist)
 - a) Better to look at growth than proficiency
 - b) Assessments vary and give different data
 - c) Biggest predictor of proficiency is prior proficiency (best measure of instructional progress)
 - (1) Point A to Point B
 - (a) What is typical progress (and above/below)
 - (2) Hoping to add growth data to Skyward parent reports
 - d) Guiding Coalition to set goals (Eagle Award, Quarterly Goals, PBIS, etc.)
 - (1) Maybe add growth goals to other awards already being given out
 - e) Language Arts Goal
 - (1) 64% of Riverside students in grades K-6 will make typical (40%-59%) or better (60%-100%) progress on the Acadience reading assessment from the beginning of the 2026-2027 school year to the end of the year.
 - (a) gone from 60.2% (2022) - high of 66.3% in 2024 (61% in 2025)
 - (b) measurement: teacher and aides will progress monitor students throughout the year and use Acadience Reading assessments at the BOY, MOY, and EOY to determine student growth.
 - (c) Action Steps:
 - (i) Assess students using Acadience Benchmarks (BOY, MOY, EOY) and progress monitoring
 - (ii) Reading Intervention: 95% groups, (2 aides funded) and Walk to Read

- (iii) Reading Software: Amira will be used to support struggling readers (100 students in grades 4-6)
 - (iv) Two Kindergarten Aides (monitoring, supporting, 95% group instruction, 1:1 and small group instruction)
 - (2) Total \$62,435
- f) Math Goal
 - (1) 69% of Riverside students in grade 3-6 will make typical (40%-59%) or better (60%-100%) progress on the RISE assessment
 - (a) gone from 64% (2022) to a high of 70% in 2023 varied through 2025 (66%)
 - (b) measurement: Teachers will monitor students' progress through the year on common formative assessments, collaborate in LCs about the assessment data and plan interventions accordingly
 - (c) action steps
 - (i) common formative assessments
 - (ii) math intervention after data analysis at weekly PLC meetings
 - (a) two paraprofessionals will be staffed (PE and STEM) to allow for PLCs
 - (iii) Effectiveness monitored through PLCs
 - (iv) Supplemental math software to address students' fact fluency
 - (v) one paraprofessional skill-specific classroom intervention
 - (2) Total: \$51,841

- (1) Success in student behavior (more things put into place, negative behavior is decreasing)
2. Jodi Packard (District Wellness Room specialist)
3. Wellness Room Data
 - a) Colors (Zones of Regulation):
 - (1) red: angry, out of control
 - (2) yellow: frustrated, silly, worries
 - (3) blue: sad, tired, sick, bored
 - (4) green: happy, regulated
 - b) Check-in
 - (1) rarely green
 - (2) Quite a few in the red and yellow zones
 - (3) majority in the blue
 - c) Minutes and activities vary by students
 - (1) some directed lessons (based on parent/teacher feedback)
 - d) Check-out
 - (1) Yellow and red are drastically decreased
 - (2) blue has shrunk as well
 - (3) green has a huge increase
 - e) As students age, they are learning to increase their self-regulation
 - f) data looks great
 - (1) doubling after lunch (will compare to last year to see if the increase of 5 minutes has decreased at all)
 - g) School Counselor is teaching monthly lessons, but it is still a team effort between individual teachers, Mental Health Team, etc.
